**FAST:** Catholics ages 18-59 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and Catholics over the age of 14 must abstain from eating meat on those days and all Fridays in Lent.

**GIVE:** pick up a Rice Bowl this weekend in the vestibule to help give back to those in need in poorer countries, or give back your time to the church by volunteering at the Cathedral Fish Fry. There are more ways to make this the best Lent yet listed in the bulletin.

### ONE ROSE, ONE LIFE Campaign

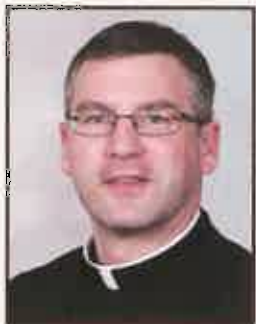
