CRC's new certified *Nature Explore Outdoor Classroom* hosts preschool ages and kindergartners. It is fully licensed and designed to foster early childhood learning through discovery in nature.

Once our CRC Eagle's leave the nest after 8th grade, the majority of students attend Lincoln Pius X High School. Pius has a 99% graduation rate and 93% of Pius graduates pursue a college education.
